The Ponce Inlet Fire Department (PIFD) responded to 95 incidents for the month of October, with 61 of the responses falling under the EMS category.

The fire department transported 54 patients in October: 16 transports from Ponce Inlet, 38 from out-of-district; the average number of transports in 24 hours was 1.7. There were 0 times in October that Ponce Inlet needed an outside agency to transport. The Ponce Inlet Fire Department has a minimum staffing requirement of 4 shift personnel; while 2 personnel will be sent for an out-of- district transport, 2 personnel remain in town and the county performs reciprocal transport until our ambulance returns.

In October a new Deputy Fire Chief was hired. Joe Landreville was selected from 12 applicants as part of an extremely competitive field of candidates. Mr. Landreville is a long-term resident of Volusia County. He graduated from New Smyrna Beach High School and has lived in the same area ever since. His work experiences for the past 40 years include being a firefighter paramedic, chief fire officer, educator at the local community college and a supervisor for the Florida Bureau of Fire Standards and Training. He holds a BA Degree in Organizational Management and is a graduate of the four- year Executive Fire Officer Program at the National Fire Academy. It is with great enthusiasm that he is returning to Volusia County to continue his public safety career as our Deputy Fire Chief.

Chief Landreville will be starting November 20.

We are very excited to welcome Chief Landreville to the department and look forward to his contribution to the town and department.



Fire Department turnout data is included with the other call related information. The fire department's goal is to have the 90th percentile time for both medical and fire calls to meet the NFPA standards. In October, the fire department met the 90th percentile for fire responses.

The intent of the heat maps is to demonstrate concentrations of calls within the community. This is a requirement of the accreditation process.
