In January, the Ponce Inlet Fire Department (PIFD) responded to a total of 108 incidents, with 72 of those falling under Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The department transported 59 patients, 12 from within Ponce Inlet and 47 from out-of-district, averaging 1.9 transports per day. Notably, only 1 transport required assistance from an outside agency during this period.

Below are the fire department highlights for January of 2025.

Accreditation Progress

The fire department continued preparing accreditation documentation for submission this summer. Once submitted, the department will be eligible for evaluation by the accrediting body to achieve final accreditation.

Fire Hose Upgrade

The department received a shipment of replacement fire hose, transitioning to a lighter and more maneuverable supply and attack hose. Additionally, the new color scheme for attack lines improves visibility in low-light situations.

Pre-Fire Plan Program

A new digital software program has been implemented, streamlining the creation and maintenance of prefire plans. These plans enhance firefighter safety by providing critical information on building layouts, hazardous materials, hydrant locations and access points during emergencies. The system will also be shared with neighboring fire departments to improve coordination and operational effectiveness. Regular updates are essential to maintain compliance with accreditation requirements and ISO scoring.

Aerial Apparatus Update

Chief Landreville collaborated with the new aerial apparatus vendor to finalize equipment and features for the Quint. Delivery of the new truck is expected in February.

AED Maintenance

The department performed maintenance on all Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in town buildings and vehicles, ensuring this critical life-saving equipment is operational and performing at peak levels.

Fire Department turnout data is included with the other call related information. The fire department's goal is to have the 90th percentile time for both medical and fire calls meet the NFPA standards. In January, the fire department met the 90th percentile for fire responses. The 90th percentile for fire department EMS responses for January was close to the NFPA standard.

To provide the public with more fire department response data, we are including hyperlinks to heat maps of the various fire department responses. The intent of the heat maps is to demonstrate concentrations of calls within the community. This is a requirement of the accreditation process. Links to the heat maps can also be found on the Town's website under the fire department section.









However, these incidents are still included in the report to ensure transparency, identify emerging trends, and provide a complete record of all response activities. While they may not significantly impact overall statistical analysis, tracking these lower-frequency incidents allows the department to monitor risks that could inform future operational planning and resource allocation.
