REGULAR MEETING MINUTES April 7, 2025

- 1. CALL TO ORDER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Pursuant to proper notice, Chair Finch called the meeting to Order at 5:30 PM in the Council Chambers, located at 4300 S. Atlantic Avenue, Ponce Inlet, Florida and led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 5 **2. ROLL CALL & DETERMINATION OF QUORUM**: A quorum was established with five regular members present; Ms. Canny was absent.

3. ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Chair Finch asked if there were any changes to the agenda; there were none.

<u>Vice-Chair Keese moved to approve the agenda as presented; seconded by Ms. LaBarre. The motion PASSED by consensus, 5-0.</u>

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

29 **A.** March 3, 2025 – Chair Finch asked if there were any changes; there were none.

Ms. LaBarre moved to approve the March 3, 2025 meeting minutes as presented; seconded by Mr. Shaffer. The motion PASSED by consensus, 5-0.

5. REPORT OF STAFF:

A. Cultural Services Update – Ms. Alex informed the Board that staff is preparing to present the previously proposed meeting time change to the Town Council for consideration. She stated the Town's Easter event will be held on April 19, and the "Ponce Preserves the Planet" event has been rescheduled to April 26.

39 40 B. Public Works Update – Mr. Wargo stated the Ponce Preserve boardwalk is open to the public and the Museum boardwalk repairs have been completed. A brief discussion ensued on the repairs and replacements that were completed. He stated staff is waiting on the manufacturer to provide the parts for the Timothy Pollard Memorial Park playground, so it will need to remain closed until the work is completed. The observation tower within Ponce Preserve will be refurbished and sealed upon completion. The bids received regarding the Timucuan Oaks Garden boardwalk and boat ramp pilings project exceeded the anticipated budget, so staff will reevaluate the scope of work and readvertise this project later. Mr. Wargo stated the foliage alongside the south sidewalk in Ponce Preserve will be cleared, and pressure washing will occur in Kay & Ayres Davies Lighthouse Park within the coming week.

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6. OLD BUSINESS: *None.*

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7. **NEW BUSINESS:**

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Discussion – Building a "Rainbow Bridge" within Ponce's Happy Tails Dog Park. A. Ms. Alex explained at the February 20, 2025 Town Council meeting, Ms. Debbie Darino proposed the installation of a "Rainbow Bridge" and an accompanying sign posted with a Rainbow Bridge poem within Ponce's Happy Tails Dog Park. This bridge is intended to serve as a memorial for pets that have passed. Ms. Alex elaborated on the proposed design and foreseeable maintenance of the Rainbow Bridge; Ms. Darino also proposed a statue of the dog, "Ponce", be constructed near the bridge. Vice-Chair Keese provided comments on the proposed location within the park and suggested using dog tags instead of hanging collars or leashes on the bridge. Ms. LaBarre provided information on engraved plaques that could be used; the Board discussed options for plaques in lieu of leashes or tags. Ms. Bell inquired about the design of the bridge and Ms. Alex assured the Board that any structure must be permitted through the Town. The Board proposed posting a sign to include the Rainbow Bridge poem or a picture of the bridge, rather than constructing the full "Rainbow Bridge." They discussed options for the Town to sell tags to hang on the sign to memorialize pets, the required maintenance for upkeep, and the location. Ms. Alex reviewed the Town's history with memorial sites and plaques. They continued discussions on potential ideas for the sign and the location of it. Chair Finch opened public participation – hearing none, public participation was closed.

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The Board recommended not to construct a "Rainbow Bridge", requested staff to research the installation of a memorial Rainbow sign on the outer fence at Ponce's Happy Tails Dog Park, and to bring this information back at a later meeting; 5-0, consensus.

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8. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: There was no public participation.

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9. BOARD/STAFF DISCUSSION: Mr. Wargo commented on the safety hazard of bike riders on the Ponce Preserve boardwalk. The Board briefly discussed the situation.

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10. ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 6:01 p.m.

Overview:

At its April 17, 2025 meeting, the Town Council approved an amended and restated lease agreement with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC for the cell tower site at Pollard Park. The agreement calls for New Cingular Wireless to provide the Town with a \$180,000 "signing bonus" following the execution of the lease agreement by both parties. The amount is based on the cost to install a protective metal structure over the two pickleball courts closest to the tower, ensuring uninterrupted play during routine cell tower maintenance. However, this funding is unrestricted and may be applied to any capital improvement projects at the Town's discretion. After discussion, the Town Council indicated interest in exploring the addition of pickleball courts instead.

Background:

At the June 3, 2024, Cultural Services Board meeting, Staff presented the issue of athletic court closures following an increase in maintenance activity on the adjacent cell tower, which resulted in frequent shutdowns of two pickleball courts and the tennis court (Attachment 1). The Board previously supported the installation of a protective structure over the pickleball courts to address safety concerns and minimize disruptions. At that time, courts were having to be closed without prior notice from the cell tower contractors. Under the new lease terms, the Town will now receive a minimum seven-day advance notice of scheduled maintenance, allowing time to proactively block out reservations.

Discussion:

In addition to the Council's direction provided at the April 17, 2025, Town Council meeting, staff has received public input suggesting the conversion of either the existing basketball court or tennis court into additional pickleball courts. Based on the attached court dimensions, conversion of the tennis court is feasible and less costly, as it already includes lighting and fencing (Attachment 2). Converting the basketball court would require expanding the surface by at least 10 feet to both east and west, which would be more costly due to existing conditions such as lighting, sidewalk proximity, and site limitations (Attachment 3). Staff has considered temporary modifications to the tennis court, such as striping for pickleball and using portable nets, as a lower-cost, flexible solution. However, either option would result in the loss of the Town's only full basketball or

tennis court. It is also important to note that increased use of athletic courts, regardless of configuration, would exacerbate existing parking limitations at Pollard Park. On busy days, park visitors already utilize overflow parking at the Ponce Inlet Community Center.

Another option could include constructing new athletic courts within the wooded parcel adjacent to the Lighthouse and Marine Science Center (Attachment 4). Like the Town's last two major park improvements, staff would seek funding through the Volusia ECHO program. However, this year's ECHO application process is significantly more complex than in previous cycles. It requires complete construction drawings at the time of application, funding for which is not currently budgeted.

Staff is seeking Board input and a formal recommendation to Town Council on how best to proceed with the \$180,000 in funding. Staff requests the Board narrow its direction to one of the following options:

1. Develop new pickleball courts, lighting, and parking within the Lighthouse parcel

- a. Aligns with Council's interest in expanding pickleball facilities
- b. Expands recreational opportunities in a new area of Town
- c. Requires complete construction drawings and significant staff time
- d. Requires development of additional parking

2. Convert the existing basketball and/or tennis courts to pickleball courts & install a half-court basketball facility at Davies Park

- a. Aligns with Council's interest in expanding pickleball facilities
- b. Results in loss of a full court for another sport
- c. Site-specific conditions pose cost and feasibility concerns
- d. Introduces active recreation to a currently passive park

3. Make no changes

- a. Maintains current facility configuration
- b. Reserves funding for future initiatives
- c. Imposes no immediate staff time or budget demands

4. Other option(s) as recommended by the Board

MEETING DATE: June 5, 2023

Between the months of December 2022 through April 2023, the Pollard Park tennis court and two of the four pickleball courts experienced a higher frequency of closures due to elevated maintenance work performed on the cell tower adjacent to these courts.

Staff has developed better lines of communication with the cell tower management company (Crown Castle) regarding upcoming closures; however, staff continues to receive feedback on the negative impacts from cancelled reservations.

Pickleball remains the fastest growing sport in America, with an overwhelming 158% participation increase over three years, according to Sports & Fitness Industry Association Topline Participation Report 2023 (**Exhibit 1**). The demand for Pollard Park visitors to play this sport remains constant, as the four courts are filled with reservations.

According to our reservation page, most reservations are made between the hours of 8:00 am-8:00 pm, and very rarely between the hours of 12:00 pm and 3:00 pm (the hottest part of the day). During the peak play hours, 90% of all athletic court reservations are made for the pickleball courts. A daily average of 78% of the available pickleball reservations are filled, compared to 13% of tennis reservation slots, and 6% of racquetball reservation slots when all courts are open (Exhibit 2).

Staff is considering potential improvements to the athletic courts within the Town to accommodate the demand as well as potential future closures due to elevated cell tower maintenance. Suggestions include installing a protective cover over the entire current pickleball courts, transforming the current basketball court into additional pickleball courts, and creating a half-court basketball court within Davies Park.

A resident recently requested staff to consider transforming the basketball court to allow for temporary tennis play during closures due to cell tower maintenance. However, to meet tennis court regulation size, the basketball court would need to be extended in both length and width, which the park cannot accommodate. Regulation size for tennis court length is 120 feet, which includes the 78-foot-long play area and space on each for serving (**Exhibit 3**). The current length of the basketball court is 67 feet.

Current staff suggestions for future Town athletic courts are as follows:

- 1. Providing a protective cover over the entirety of the current pickleball courts;
- 2. Utilizing the space provided within Pollard Park to add pickleball courts- this may include transforming the current basketball court;
- 3. Creating a half-court basketball court within Davies Park

On this item, staff is seeking input from the Board on ideas for potential future improvements for the Town's athletic courts. Specifically, if there is consensus on staff's suggestions above, or if there are any additional recommendations from the Board to the Town Council.

None of these projects would be requested in the Town's budget for fiscal year 23/24, but it is important to determine the Board's preferences for future planning purposes.

SFIA'S TOPLINE REPORT SHOWS PHYSICAL ACTIVITY RATES INCREASED FOR A FIFTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Pickleball Remains Fastest Growing Sport in America — 124 Activities Tracked in Report

SILVER SPRING, MD (February 22, 2023) – More Americans participated in at least one sport, fitness exercise, or outdoor recreation activity in 2022 than in any of the five previous years, according to the newly released Sports & Fitness Industry Association (SFIA) <u>Topline Participation Report</u>. Considered the sports and fitness industry's essential reference document for sports participation, the 2023 SFIA Topline Report tracks participation rates of Americans aged six and older, across 124 different sports, fitness, and outdoor activities, including a section dedicated to the impact of COVID-19 on participation rates.

For the fifth consecutive year, activity in the U.S. continued to increase. In 2022, 77.6% of all Americans, or 236.9 million people, participated in at least one activity during the 2022 calendar year. Based on trend analysis into and out of the pandemic disruption, the United States saw a 9.2% increase in total participation rates from 2017 and a 1.9% increase from 2021.

"This year's report reinforces that Americans are prioritizing physical activity as they establish habits and routines in a post-pandemic environment," states Tom Cove, President & CEO, SFIA. "But, we will make a mistake if we take some good signals for granted. Looking forward, sports and fitness delivery systems must commit to providing accessible, reasonably priced, and high-quality experiences to keep athletes engaged."

Pickleball continued its incredible rise in America and remains the fastest-growing sport. Participation nearly doubled in 2022, increasing by 85.7% year-over-year and by an astonishing 158.6% over three years. But pickleball is not the only racquet sport to see continued growth. For the first time since 2015, every racquet sport increased its total participation number compared to the previous year.

In terms of team sports, the overall participation rate approached, but did not exceed, the 2019 rate. Basketball, outdoor soccer, and flag football all posted three-year increases of over 4.5%, with basketball leading the way with a 13% increase since 2019. Notably, evidence that "CORE participation" cumulatively across all team sports (a frequency measure to capture those most active) continues to lag suggests while athletes are playing, they may not be playing as much as they used to.

Lifestyle activities generally remained very popular. Golf and tennis have grown more than 20% since 2019, and yoga grew more than 10% in that same time period. Trail running and day hiking participation grew for the fifth straight year. However, facility-based fitness activities like elliptical, group stationary cycling, and weight resistance machines, which suffered as clubs were shuttered during COVID, have struggled to return to pre-pandemic levels.




Exhibit 3: Tennis court regulation size



A. Discussion of potential future improvements on the Town's athletic courts – Ms. French explained that two of the four pickleball courts have experienced a higher frequency of closures due to elevated maintenance work performed on the cell tower adjacent to the courts. She reviewed the demand for the Town's pickleball courts and the potential improvements to accommodate the demand as well as future closures due to cell tower maintenance. Suggestions include: 1) installing a protective cover over the entire current pickleball courts; 2) utilizing the space provided within Pollard Park to add pickleball courts (which may include transforming the current basketball court); and 3) creating a half-court basketball court within Davies Park. Staff is seeking input for future improvements on the provided suggestions or if there are additional recommendations; she noted that none of these projects will be requested in the Town's budget for FY 2023/24. Ms. Keese asked if the time to reserve the pickleball courts could be earlier. Ms. French replied yes and explained that staff is currently testing a new court reservation system. Chair Bell stated she is against changing the basketball court; Vice Chair Finch agreed. Members discussed the demand for the pickleball courts and the possibility of having "open" court times and how the new reservation system will work. Chair Bell opened public comments.

Ms. Mary Lou Fillingame, 33 Ocean Way Drive, referred to the open-play pickleball being discussed and stated that when she is playing, they offer for others to play with them; she does not think reservations are a problem and that things could be left as is. She asked about cameras for the pickleball courts. Ms. French explained that is not part of this agenda item, but it has been submitted with the Information Technology (IT) department's budget and is under consideration. Ms. Fillingame stated she does not think the Town should remove the tennis or basketball courts; she asked if there are any other green areas at Pollard Park that could be used for an additional pickleball court. Ms. French explained it is very restricted; however, there are ideas that maybe one more pickleball court could be added. Mr. Griffith noted that the contract with the cell tower owners is currently under negotiation and that there are structural issues with the tennis courts that will need to be addressed in the near future. Discussion continued regarding the pickleball courts; how open play would be managed, and how the cell tower maintenance affects court closures, and what could be negotiated with the cell tower owners regarding notification of closures.

The Board agreed by consensus to install protective covers over the pickleball courts; leaving all courts as they are; and potentially bringing this item back to the Board in the future for further discussion; 5-0.





